Why Schools

- 66% of districts report already helping families with **BADGERCARE+**
- 83% of pupil services staff are interested in gaining skills and knowledge about **BADGERCARE+**

- 83,000 Wisconsin children remain uninsured
- Most of those uninsured children are eligible for **BADGERCARE+**

Wisconsin's Public Health Insurance Program

- Available to virtually all uninsured children
- Parent may also be eligible

- Sports Physicals
- Dental Care
- Eye Exams
- Prescriptions
- Vaccinations
- Hospital Stays
- Prenatal Care
- Mental Health
